Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that India is taking the lead in shaping the global future. He mentioned that the country is advancing on an unprecedented scale in all sectors. Addressing the World Summit organized by a private media outlet, the Prime Minister noted that when the world was mired in uncertainty, India emerged as a beacon of hope. Highlighting issues such as COVID-19, the global economy, inflation, unemployment, climate change, and wars, Mr. Modi emphasized that global situations also impact India. The Prime Minister further said that in just 125 days of the NDA government's third term, infrastructure projects worth 9 lakh crore rupees have been approved, and 15 new Vande Bharat trains have been launched. He said that the construction of 8 airports has begun, rooftop solar plants have been installed in 5 lakh homes, and more than 90 crore trees have been planted. Modi also highlighted that during these 125 days, the country's FOREX reserves have grown to over 700 billion dollars.

India and China have reached an agreement on the patrolling arrangements along the Line of Actual Control in eastern Ladakh. Briefing media in New Delhi, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said, this agreement can lead to disengagement and resolution of tension that began in 2020. He said elaborate discussion between both sides resulted in an agreement on patrolling arrangements along the border areas. Misri added that India has been in discussion with Chinese interlocutors at various levels.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone and inaugurated multiple development projects worth over 6,700 crore rupees from his parliamentary constituency of Varanasi today. The initiatives include the inauguration of three airports at Rewa in Madhya Pradesh, Ambikapur in Chhattisgarh, and Saharanpur in Uttar Pradesh, developed under the Regional Connectivity Scheme UDAN (Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik). Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister emphasised that development projects pertaining to education, skill development, sports, healthcare, and tourism, among other sectors, have been presented to Varanasi today, which will not only improve the quality of life of the people but also create employment opportunities for the youth. Modi highlighted that the

government has initiated a huge campaign for infrastructural development in the country in the last 10 years.

The 13th Battalion of the Rajputana Rifles of Indian Army along with BJP leader Tai Tagak, seniors of Neelam village of Keyi Panyor district on Sunday paid homage to the martyr, unsung hero Neelam Tebi on his death anniversary, who sacrificed his life for the nation on October 20, 1962 in the Indo-China war. The State government has sanctioned 5 crore rupees in the first phase for the construction of the memorial, which will come up in an area of approximately 45,000 square metres. The Indian Army, under the able leadership of Colonel Sangam Singh, Commanding Officer of the 13th Rajputana Rifles, organized the event with grandeur and reverence.

On Police Commemoration Day today, Prime Minister Narendra Modi honored the bravery and sacrifice of the country's police personnel. In a social media post, he praised their unwavering dedication to ensuring the safety of the people. He said that they exemplify courage and determination. Modi also commended the proactive efforts and assistance of police personnel during humanitarian challenges.

Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein flagged off the Cycling Expedition at Namsai today. The event was attended by Education MInister Pasang Dorjee Sona, Women Child Development Minister Dasunglu Pul, senior dignitaries from Indian Army, Indo Tibetan Border Police; Government of Arunachal, Police Officials, NEEPCO, NCC cadets and local youth of Namsai and Tezu. A total 62 cyclists

will cycle their way through the picturesque landscape of the Lohit Valley on the 62nd Anniversary of the Walong Day.

In the Archery World Cup Final, India's Deepika Kumari clinched the silver medal in the women's recurve category in Tlaxcala, Mexico today. She faced a defeat to Li Jiaman of China, 0-6 in the Final. Deepika entered the final by defeating Alejandra Valencia of the host country, Mexico, 6-4, in the Semi-final. This is the fifth time that Deepika Kumari finished as a runner-up at the Archery World Cup.
