Chief Justice of India Dr. Justice D.Y. Chandrachud in an exclusive interview with Akashvani News yesterday has called for greater participation of women in the workplace including the judiciary. The chief justice added that greater female representation highlights the lived experiences of women, enriching decision-making with diverse perspectives. He also highlighted that in the open recruitment examinations for the district judiciary across the country, over 50 percent of the recruits are women. He further expressed hope that this trend will pave the way to more women rising to higher judicial positions in the future.

Arunachal Press Club remembered late Taro Chatung, the first journalist of the state, on his 5th death anniversary today. The members of the press fraternity paid tribute to the pioneer at a small function held at the press club premises. Late Taro Chatung is considered as the first journalist of Arunachal Pradesh. He started his journalism and filmmaking career after leaving his state civil service job in 1988. He was also a state gold medal awardee. Late

Chatung was known for his News & Views programme in Doordarshan, and was a founding member the Arunachal Press Club (APC) and the Arunachal Pradesh Union of Working Journalists (APUWJ).

President Droupadi Murmu speaking at the convocation, NIT Raipur, yesterday, said that Artificial Intelligence (AI) has become a priority area for the entire world and asserted the emerging technology will open up vast opportunities for youths in various sectors.
