NEWS IN ORDER:-

DEFENCE:

Union Minister for Defence, Rajnath Singh said that due to the discipline and courage of the Indian soldiers, India and China reached on consensus to resolve issues at some areas along the LAC. Singh was addressing the soldiers at Bada Khana at Tezpur in Assam. He said that India always believed in keeping cordial relations with the neighbours. He firmly said that keeping in mind the interests of forces, the government would take necessary steps in this process of peace restoration. Singh commended the unwavering spirit, steadfast commitment and remarkable courage of the troops who serve on the frontlines in difficult circumstances, terming them as a true source of inspiration to the youth. He mentioned that the nation will forever remain indebted to the soldiers who serve the motherland with unmatched bravery and dedication. He urged the soldiers to remain alert and ready to deal with threats which may emerge from the ever-evolving global security scenario.

CANDIDATES:

In Assam, 34 candidates are in the fray for the bye elections to five assembly seats while in Meghalaya, 6 candidates remained in the fray to contest the bypoll from Gambegre Assembly constituency. On the last date for withdrawal of nominations yesterday, there was no withdrawal of nominations from Gambegre constituency. However, in Assam, one candidate withdrew his nominations from Dholai constituency leaving a total of 8 candidates in the fray. There are 11 candidates in Samaguri and 3 candidates in Sidli seat, four candidates in Behali and 8 candidates will try their political luck from Bongaigaon seat. Over 10 lakh voters can exercise their voting rights in the five

Assembly seats in Assam. The Congress and the NDA are contesting in all the five seats. For the NDA, BJP fielded candidates in three assembly seats and the Asom Gana Parishad and UPPL fielded candidate in one seat each. The polling will be held on November 13 and votes will be counted on November 23.

FESTIVAL:

DoNER Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia will inaugurate the two-day Shillong Cherry Blossom Festival which will begin on November 15. Meghalaya Tourism Minister, Paul Lyngdoh informed that the State Government is awaiting a confirmation from Japan on its official who will attend the festival. On November 18-19, there will be Lit Fest and it will be attended by renowned writers like Vikram Seth, Shobhaa De and others. Meanwhile, the Meghalaya Department of Arts & Culture, will organize KoreM- a cultural collaboration between Korea and Meghalaya at the Ward's Lake, Shillong tomorrow at 11 am.
