ROZGAR:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday distributed more than 51 thousand appointment letters to newly appointed youth in various government departments and organizations. Speaking through video conferencing, the Prime Minister said, efforts are underway to provide permanent government jobs and the government is committed to provide employment opportunities to the youth. The Rozgar Mela was organized at 40 locations across the country including Shillong in Meghalaya where 207 candidates received appointment letters for positions in various government departments. Union Minister of State for Textiles, Pabitra Margherita attended the function in Shillong which was coordinated by the Department of Posts, NE Circle, Shillong. Young achievers from Meghalaya, Manipur, Nagaland, Mizoram, Tripura, and Assam gathered to mark this milestone. The Rozgar mela was also held in Itanagar. Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Prof. SP Singh Baghel distributed appointment letters to the newly recruited candidates.

PM:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday asserted that augmenting healthcare infrastructure is the government's priority as the nation's progress accelerates when its citizens are healthier. He added that with this vision, the centre has established five pillars of health policy, prioritizing citizens' well-being. These are preventive healthcare, timely diagnosis, affordable medicines and treatment, proper healthcare in small towns and villages, and technology expansion in the healthcare sector. The Prime Minister was inaugurating and laying foundation stones of multiple projects related to the health sector worth around 12 thousand 850 crore rupees on the occasion of Dhanvantari Jayanti and 9th Ayurveda Day. He also inaugurated facility and service extensions at various AIIMS including Kalyani in West Bengal, Guwahati in Assam and in New Delhi, which includes a Jan Aushadhi Kendra.

CANDIDATES:

In Sikkim, two candidates of the Sikkim Democratic Front have withdrawn their candidature from the bye-elections yesterday. Sikkim Democratic Front candidate, Prem Bahadur Bhandari and Daniel Rai have submitted their withdrawal of nominations to the Returning Officer. Bhandari withdrew his nomination papers as SDF candidate for Soreng-Chakung constituency while Daniel Rai withdrew his candidature for Namchi-Singhithang Assembly constituency. Thus, Aditya Golay of the Sikkim Krantikari Morcha has remained the lone candidate in the bye-elections for Soreng-Chakung Assembly constituency. Similarly, Satish Chandra Rai of the Sikkim Krantikari Morcha became the sole candidate for Namchi-Singhithang Assembly constituency.

STONE:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of the Critical Care Block of District Hospital of Thoubal in Manipur through video conferencing from New Delhi yesterday. The Prime

Minister also launched, inaugurated and laid the foundation stones of other health sector projects worth over 12 thousand eight hundred fifty crore rupees. The construction of the Critical Care Block of District Hospital of Thoubal under PM-ABHIM is around 16 crore rupees. Manipur Chief Minister, N Biren Singh and other ministers attended the function. The Chief Minister said that the government would consider setting up more medical colleges in other districts of the State like Thoubal and Ukhul. He also launched the revised State Action Plan on Climate Change and Human Health.
