The severe cyclone 'Dana' formed over the east-central Bay of Bengal is set to make landfall along the Odisha coast somewhere Bhitarkanika and Dhamra late toniaht. The Meteorological Department has predicted wind speeds of 100 to 120 km per hour during the landfall of 'Dana' and the landfall process will continue till early morning of tomorrow with widespread impact to the region. The severe cyclone is moving at a speed of 15 km per hour in the Bay of Bengal. All air services from and to Biju Patnaik International Airport at Bhubaneswar have been cancelled from this evening till 9 am tomorrow morning. People living in low-lying areas in coastal areas are being shifted to multipurpose cyclone centers. All schools, colleges, universities, and many government institutions have been closed till tomorrow.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping Wednesday endorsed the India-China agreement on patrolling and disengagement along the Line of Actual Control in eastern Ladakh directions and issued to revive various bilateral mechanisms. In the nearly 50-minute meeting held on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit at Kazan, Russia, Modi underscored the importance of properly handling differences and disputes and not allowing them to disturb peace and tranquillity in border areas and that mutual trust, mutual respect and mutual sensitivity should remain the basis of the relations. Prime Minister Narendra Modi arrived in New Delhi after attending the BRICS Summit in Kazan, Russia.

Governor K.T Parnaik exhorted the Vice Chancellors to focus on the quality of education, governance aspects, use of technology and social responsibilities to be adopted by the higher educational institutions. Chief Minister Pema Khandu also participated in the marathon along with sports minister Kento Jini, MLAs Zingnu Namchoom, Tsering Lhamu and Tseten Chombay. This Marathon is organised by Arunachal Pradesh Government and Indian Army jointly.
