The event, organized by the Department of Telecommunications, Government of India, in partnership with the Cellular Operators Association of India, saw over 250 companies and 400 startups, making it one of the largest telecom and digital technology events in Asia.

The National Level Monitor, team led by S K Chauhan from the Ministry of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj visited Peren district today. The team held a meeting with various Head of Offices under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner of Peren, Hiazu Meru. Addressing the officials, Mr. Chauhan said, the purpose of the visit is to monitor various programs implemented by the Ministry across the district. He also said, the team will conduct field visit to 10 selected villages to inspect various schemes implemented under the concern departments.

The Chakhesang Students' Union (CSU) today issued a 48-hour ultimatum to the National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (NHIDCL), demanding immediate repairs to the deteriorating Kohima-Jessami road, particularly the Chakhabama-Kikruma stretch under Package-II. In a letter addressed to the General Manager of NHIDCL's Project Management Unit in Pfutsero, CSU highlighted the years of public hardship caused by the hazardous condition of the road, which has been marred by landslides, blockages and deep potholes, putting commuters at risk. The union urged NHIDCL to clear road blockages, repair potholes, and install proper drainage systems within the stipulated time. It further cautioned that failure to address these issues, would force the union to take its own measures, holding NHIDCL accountable for any ensuing consequences.
