Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has emphasised the government's commitment to fiscal discipline. Kautilya Economic Conclave in New Delhi which is being held till the 6th of this month. The Finance Minister said, fiscal deficit is estimated to decline further from 5.6 per cent in Financial Year 2024 to 4.9 per cent in 2025.

Ms Sitharaman noted that by 2047, the Viksit Bharat will usher prosperity not just to Indians but to the rest of the world by becoming central to a vibrant exchange of ideas, technology and culture. Both Indian and international scholars and policy makers are discussing some of the most important issues confronting Indian economy and economies of the Global South.



Reacting to news published in local media over several educated youths being lured into Southeast Asian countries on promise of high paying jobs, Nagaland Police have asked parents or relatives of these youths to reach police for assistance. The Bureau of Immigration, Ministry of Home, Government of India has said that around 30 thousand Indians who have travelled to Cambodia, Myanmar, and Vietnam between January 2022 to May 2024 on visitor visa have not returned. Southern Angami Youth Organisation, SAYO has asked the National Highways & Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited, NHIDCL to

restore National Highway-2 from Kohima to Mao road within 15 days and initiate upgradation work. In a representation written to Deputy Chief Minister, TR Zeliang today, SAYO president Metekhrielie Mejura expressed concerns over deplorable road condition and negligence of the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways and NHIDCL despite repeated appeals.

(Mete byte: National Highway 2 or Asian highway-1 condition is alarming, with deteriorated road surfaces rendering it impassable for all vehicles, aging bridges and culverts on the verge of collapse, and inadequate infrastructure posing significant risks to commuters' safety. Despite its strategic importance, connecting Southern Angamis, neighboring districts of Nagaland and Manipur, this critical artery remains neglected. SAYO had repeatedly appealed for the restoration of the highway, however no concern had been shown by Ministry of Roads, transports and highways and the NHIDCL. In addition, a Fact-Finding Technical Team was formed on June 15 this year by the state government however the team could not submit their reports or findings to the concerned authority till today. We urge the authority to take immediate action to restore NH-2 within 15 days and initiate upgradation work to a full-fledged two-lane road, replacing or renovating aging bridges and culverts. Failure to act within the stipulated period, we the SAYO will take severe measures holding the MoRTH, the NHIDCL, Fortune Company, contractor and sub-contractors for the losses incurred to our people.)

The Union further said it will impose ban of more than 3 axle wheelers from plying on NH-2 until necessary upgradation are completed.
