Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority, in a weather update has informed that Nagaland will experience cloudy heavy rainfall and cloudy moderate rain in almost all the districts in the coming days till 5th October, 2024. It informed that these showers may be accompanied with thunderstorm and lightning at isolated places. During this period, cloudy heavy rainfall is expected in Kohima, Niuland, Noklak, and Peren. The remaining districts may receive Cloudy Moderate rain and Overcast Moderate rain. The NSDMA also siad that lowland and foothill districts including Dimapur, Nuiland, Chumukedima, Bhandari, Pangti, Tizit, and Tuli are vulnerable to inundated water logging and flash floods due to possibility of excessive precipitation in the hill sector.
