Prime Minister Narendra Modi has lauded the completion of three years of the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan, stating that the initiative has emerged as a transformative in revolutionising India's infrastructure. He added that the seamless integration of various stakeholders has led to boosting

Union Minister of Tribal Affairs Jual Oram is on a three day visit to Nagaland from today. On his arrival, the Union Minister called on Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio at his private residence in Sovima. On behalf of the people of Nagaland, Mr Rio extended gratitude for his visit, and for his continued support for the State. He wished the Union Minister a pleasant stay in the state. The Union Minister also visited the Durga Temple at Dimapur and offered prayers to Maa Durga. Speaking to Akashvani News Kohima exclusively, Mr Oram apprised of his meeting with Chief Minister Rio. He said they discussed about various developmental works within the state. He also mentioned that he had discussions regarding fund utilisation of the Eklavya Model Residential School.

Later he also had a meeting with the Marwari Samaj. Mr Oram will visit Zunheboto tomorrow, wherein he will have a meeting with the district administration and other departmental officers to review various central government schemes implemented in the district. He will also take a site visit in the district, including interaction with local leaders and organisations. On the last and third day of the visit, Mr Oram will attend the inauguration programme of the new Community hall at Indisen village in Dimapur. Followed by a state level review meeting at Dimapur DC conference hall and a press meet.



Representing the Association of Minority Tribes of Nagaland, President, Kuki Inpi Nagaland L. Singsit said, they are in support of implementation of Register of Indigenous Inhabitants of Nagaland (RIIN) by the state government which the Nagaland Cabinet has approved to start implementing the RIIN on 20th September 2024. He said, they were surprised that RIIN will be only for the four tribes and as minority tribes they have become very apprehensive. He said, they have spoken out in support of RIIN in both the district and state level consultations.

He said, they are not against RIIN as such and there has been lots of deliberations and consultations in the Government level with all Tribal Hohos in Kohima. Mr. Singsit said, several times, there was state level committee and district level coordination committee and they have been participating in this process.

While acknowledging that the government may have taken this decision because of technicalities, they have submitted a representation expressing their concerns. Mr. Singsit expressed that they are the citizens of this state and are ready to follow whatever the government says and to treat them in the same way as other tribes of Nagaland.



The Assam Rifles organized a National Integration Tour for 20 students and 4 teachers from Meluri in Phek District. The tour, spanning several cities including Bengaluru, Belgaum, and Delhi, concluded with a Flagin Ceremony held at Kenguruse Hall in Kohima today. During the ceremony, Major General Manish Kumar, SM, Inspector General of Assam Rifles (North), commended the participants, and emphasized the importance of travel in fostering an understanding of India's cultural diversity.
