Paying tribute to the supreme sacrifice of the valiant police personnel across the country, DGP Nagaland Rupin Sharma said today is not mere day of mourning but a day of celebrating the spirit of selfless sacrifice of the police men and women who have become immortal through their deeds.

On the Police Commemoration Day, Deputy Chief Minister Y Patton who is also in-charge of Home, remembered and honour the courage, dedication and sacrifice of the brave men and women in uniform who lay down their lives in the line of duty. He said, their commitment to maintaining law and order, often under challenging circumstances, ensures the safety of our society. Mr. Patton called upon all to always remember the valour and continue to support our police forces in their mission to safeguard our society.

Nagaland's Director General of Police (DGP), Rupin Sharma said the police department is preparing to advertise 935 police constable posts that were previously quashed by the High Court. Addressing media on the sideline of a program in Kohima today, Sharma said the decision to cancel the appointments came after the court found that the positions had not been properly advertised. He informed that the necessary administrative measures are expected to be completed within six months. Sharma also said that those affected by the court's decision, including the constables whose appointments were canceled, have the option to pursue legal remedies. He said, they can appeal, request reviews or file revision petitions with the Guwahati High Court, its Principal Bench, or the Supreme Court. The DGP added that the police department will comply with any further court orders that may arise during this process.

Labour and Employment Minister, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya launched the eShram, One Stop Solution for Unorganized Workers, in New Delhi today. Speaking at the event, the Union Minister said that every day around sixty to ninety thousand workers are joining the platform. He added that the platform will provide seamless access to different social security schemes to the unorganized workers. Dr. Mandaviya urged all unorganized workers to register on the portal and take advantage of the various welfare schemes designed for their benefit. The primary aim of the initiative is to integrate information about beneficiaries of all social security and welfare schemes meant for unorganized workers in an effective manner through a single platform.

The Naga People's Front (NPF), the second oldest regional party in India and the oldest in Northeast India, today observed its 62nd Foundation Day at its Central Office in Kohima. Party President Apong Pongener, in his address, urged party members to reinvent their ideas and work collectively to revive the party and reclaim its past glory. Pongener highlighted the NPF's significance in Naga identity, recalling its founding on October 21, 1963, under A. Kevichüsa. He expressed pride in the party's legacy, noting its position as the second oldest regional political party in the country, only behind Tamil Nadu's DMK.

Pongener praised the dedication of NPF's legislators and party workers, particularly those in Nagaland and Manipur, for their contributions in sustaining the party.

Phangnon Konyak highlighted that the tournament, initially started to restore peace in the conflict-ridden town, has now become a symbol of hope, providing a platform for young Naga athletes. Konyak also noted that while Naga youths have abundant talents, it is the lack of infrastructure that hinders further growth in sports. Eight teams, including Northeast Youngster Football School from Manipur are competing in this year's edition. In the opening match today, Son Kük Laang FC edged out Tiaren FC with a narrow 1-0 victory.
