Prime Minister Narendra Modi today expressed concern over frauds going on in the name of Digital Arrests. Addressing the nation in his Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani, the Prime Minister underlined that all investigative agencies are working together with the state governments to deal with such frauds going on in the name of digital arrest. He reiterated that there is no provision of digital arrest under law.

The Prime Minister played a conversation between a victim and a fraudster for listeners of Mann Ki Baat. Prime Minister said people from every class and age group have fallen victim to Digital Arrest, losing lakhs of rupees out of sheer fear. He urged people to not get scared when they receive such fraudulent calls. He sought to make people aware that investigative agencies never inquire through phone or video calls.

Prime Minister asked victims of such cyber frauds to raise awareness among people about it. They can use #SafeDigitalIndia for awareness. He also urged schools and colleges to involve students in the campaign against cyber scams.

Former Minister and eight-time MLA of Nagaland Legislative Assembly, NLA T A Ngullie passed away today in Dimapur. Except for the sixth House, Late Ngullie represented the 37-Tyui Assembly Constituency from the first to the ninth NLA. Nagaland Assembly Speaker Sharingain Longkumer, Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio, Deputy Chief Minister Y Patton, Advisor and BJP MLA Imkong L. Imchen, State units of the Congress and Lok Janshakti Party Ramvilas have expressed sadness and condoled his demise. Late Ngullie served the State in different capacities including Minister in-charge of Finance, Revenue and Electricity in 1982. Minister of Agriculture, Horticulture and Irrigation in 1989. He also served as the Deputy Speaker and Leader of displaying unwavering dedication to the opposition, development. NLA Speaker Longkumer said that Late Ngullie's compassion for the welfare of the underprivileged and his lifelong contributions has left an indelible mark on the State of Nagaland. He said in his death, the state has lost a veteran leader and the void created will be difficult to fill. On behalf of the 14th NLA and on his own behalf, Mr Longkumer conveyed deepest sympathy and heartfelt

Infantry Day is being observed across the country today to acknowledge the contributions of Infantry, the largest fighting arm of the Indian Army. This day has a unique significance, as on this day in 1947, Infantry-men from the Indian Army became the first troops to land at Srinagar airport, forcing the invaders backed by Pakistan to withdraw. On this occasion, Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan and Chief of Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi laid wreaths at the National War Memorial in New Delhi.



Union Home Minister Amit Shah today inaugurated a newly constructed passenger terminal and a cargo gate named 'Maitri Dwar' at the Petrapole Land Port on India-Bangladesh border in West Bengal. The crossing at Petrapole situated in North 24 Parganas district of the state is the largest land port in South Asia. The passenger terminal will facilitate international trade and movement of twenty thousand passengers per day. The 'Maitri Dwar' cargo gate is a joint facility agreed upon by both countries.
