Prime Minister Modi, Spanish PM launch C-295 aircraft manufacturing facility in Vadodara.

Two-day seminar on promotion of millets in India commences in Chumoukedima.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Spanish Counterpart Pedro Sanchez jointly inaugurated the TATA Aircraft Complex to manufacture C-295 Military aircraft in Vadodara today. This is the first private sector Final Assembly Line for the manufacturing of military aircraft in India. Addressing the occasion, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said Tata Aircraft Complex reinforces India's position as a trusted partner in global aerospace manufacturing. He added that the factory would not only strengthen the India-Spain ties but also empower the Make in India and Make For the World Mission.

Stressing India's rising capabilities in defence manufacturing, Mr Modi said the day is not far when India will manufacture civilian aircraft for the world and India's MSME sector will have a big role to play in it. Talking about the strong people-to-people ties between India and Spain through food, films and football, the Prime Minister said both countries have decided to celebrate the year 2026 as the year of Culture Tourism and AI.

Speaking on the occasion, Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said the partnership between Airbus and Tata will contribute to the progress of the Indian aerospace industry and will open new doors for the arrival of other European companies.

Nagaland Deputy Chief Minister T.R. Zeliang today held a meeting with the Commander of 15 BRTF at Dimapur. They discussed on the issues facing the Kohima-Pedi-Peren road, which is basically a portion of the Kohima-Lekie (Assam) road. Deputy Chief Minister raised the concern of the public, particularly by Western Angami Public Organisation and Nagaland Zeliang People Organisation, as to how an incomplete project can be inaugurated by the Union Defence Minister. The BRTF Commander clarified that the inauguration will in no way hinder the ongoing works and that the whole stretch of the road will be completed by March 2025. Further it was also brought to light that the ongoing work is not a new construction project but rather a repair and maintenance work which is undertaken every five years, and on special cases after 4 years. The Deputy Chief Minister asked the BRTF to set chainage and timeline accordingly so that specific target can be achieved. He also assured State Government's assistance in whatever means possible for any projects undertaken by BRTF so that projects can be completed in stipulated time with quality works on grounds. The Commander also assured that State government will be kept updated on the works carried out in the State so that works can be

carried out with better coordination and understanding each other's position.

A two-day seminar focused on the promotion of millets in India was held on Monday at Naithu Resort, Chumoukedima. This event was organized by the North-Eastern Regional Agricultural Marketing Corporation (NERAMAC) under the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) and the Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare, Government of India. Additional Director, Agriculture S Yongchang Phom said millets were always a part of the diet of the ancestors and that it was essential to preserve and promote it for food security, agri-diversity and its nutritious nature. He appreciated NERAMAC's efforts for taking up the case of millet consumption.

NERAMAC Managing Director, Rajiv Ashok said that Millet is a 'superfood' and a collaborative effort between NERAMAC and the Nagaland Government would yield beneficial results to farmers. He lauded the efforts of the Nagaland government and farmers in producing and popularizing millets in the state. Mr Ashok said Government of India's drive towards this produce over the last few years has led to the world recognizing it in the form of an International Year of Millets in 2023, he stated. The event saw stalls displaying Millet products for sale and awareness of the public at large.

Observation of Vigilance Awareness Week 2024 to promote probity in public life and achieve a corruption free society commenced today across the country. The theme of the week is, Culture of Integrity for Nation's Prosperity. Officers and staff of Akashvani Kohima led by Deputy Director General (Engineering) and Head of Office, K. K. Rengma joined the nation in taking the integrity pledge.

The Wokha District Planning and Development Board (DPDB) meeting held on 25th October discussed issuance of land patta for government departments. MLA and Chairman DPDB Wokha, Y. No items other than the Reduced Emission firecrackers or Improved crackers and

Reduced Emission firecrackers or Green crackers which Safe Water and Air Sprinklers (SWAS as prescribed and approved by the Petroleum and Explosive Safety Organization will be used during the permitted hours.
