Nagaland Government has issued guidelines for obtaining duplicate appointment order and official document relating to service matters. According to the guidelines, upon losing the original document, employee has to file a First Information Report (FIR) at the nearest police station within 30 days. The employee should also publish a Lost Document notice in the local newspapers. Authenticity of the employee's details will be verified by the Head of Department for nongazetted employees and Administrative Head of Department for gazetted employees. It stated that prior approval should be obtained from the Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department before issuing the duplicate document. It added that the duplicate document

should contain the same terms and conditions as the original, and alterations or modifications will not be permitted under any circumstances. The Departments have been directed to ensure that originality of the document is retained by making timely entries in the Service Book and strictly maintaining the Guard file and other modes of record keeping.

To ensure smooth operations and to provide eye care and treatment to the poorest patients, the hospital will operate on a cross-subsidization model, whereby funds received from paying patients will be used to treat patients in need.



Advisor for NSDMA and New & Renewable Energy, Z Nyusietho Nyuthe has said that Nagaland has experienced a paradigm shift, where

meritocracy has emerged as the guiding principle in competitive exams.
