Dimapur Police has arrested eight persons from Assam, Manipur and West Bengal who were part of an inter-state gang involved in drugging and snatching of vehicles. A press release from the Commissioner of Police, Dimapur stated that two vehicles were also recovered in the process. According to the release, routine investigation into a missing person FIR lodged at East Police Station unraveled an organized network of criminal gangs operating in Nagaland, Assam, Manipur and West Bengal. It said the modus operandi of the gang involved hiring of inter-state plying commercial vehicles by posing as prospective clients. Gang members would befriend drivers, give food items laced with drugs and snatch away the vehicles while drivers were in unconscious

state. The mastermind was identified as one Shymalendu Roy from West Bengal. The release stated that relying on digital evidences collected through technical surveillance, two gang members were arrested from Manipur, four from Assam and two from Dimapur. The East Police Station team was led by Investigating Officer (I/O) Assistant Sub-Inspector, Ikato Sema under the supervision of Assistant Commissioner of Police East Imkongsangba Jamir. In this regard, the Dimapur Police has cautioned commercial vehicle drivers and owners to be aware of the prevalence of such crimes and report instances of missing drivers and vehicles to police without delay.

Vice president Jagdeep Dhankhar said that commercialization of education is adversely impacting the quality of education. Mr. Dhankhar was speaking at a function of a private educational institution in Rajasthan's Sikar this afternoon. He said that education becoming a business is never good for the future of the nation. He said that education was never a source of income, but was a medium of sacrifice, medium for charity and for building a healthy society. Mr. Dhankhar rued that today education has become a 'commodity' which is being sold for profit and this is adversely impacting the quality of education.

The Vice president said that industries are the biggest beneficiaries of research and innovations, which gives power to the nation in front of the world. The vice president also praised the national education policy, calling it a game changer.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has said that by investing in cuttingedge technologies and nurturing a robust defence ecosystem, the government has ensured that the armed forces remain future-ready and resilient in an evolving global landscape. The Minister made this statement while addressing the 62nd National Defence College M. Phil Convocation Ceremony in New Delhi today.
