Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully conducted three flight tests of the 4th Generation Very Short Range Air Defence System at the Pokhran Field Firing Ranges in Rajasthan. The tests, conducted in last two days were carried out against a high-speed target, demonstrating very critical parameters of maximum range and maximum altitude interception. Ministry of Defence said, these development trials showcased repeatability of hitto-kill capability of the weapon system in various target engagement scenarios covering approaching, receding and crossing modes. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has congratulated DRDO, the Armed Forces and the Industry involved in successful development trials.

As tensions escalate in West Asia, French President Emmanuel Macron yesterday called for a halt on its arms deliveries to Israel for use in Gaza, provoking a sharp response from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. President Macron also criticised Prime Minister Netanyahu's decision to send troops for ground operations into Lebanon. On the other hand, the Israeli Prime Minister in a video message, slammed the French President saying all civilized countries should be standing firmly by Israel's fight against the forces of barbarism led by Iran.

Meanwhile, the Israeli forces bombed a mosque in Deir al-Balah in Gaza, killing at least 21 Palestinians and wounding dozens others. Israel also expanded its strike in Lebanon yesterday. It bombarded deep in the north part of the country for the first time, targeting both armed groups, Hezbollah and Hamas.

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu arrived in New Delhi today on a five-day state visit at the invitation of President Droupadi Murmu. This is his first visit to India since assuming office. During the visit, he is scheduled to hold high-level meetings with President Droupadi Murmu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other senior officials of the Indian government. Mr. Muizzu will be accorded with a ceremonial reception at the Rashtrapati Bhawan scheduled for Monday.
