Deputy Chief Minister and minister in-charge of National Highway, TR Zeliang said, 2-Laning works on National Highway-2, specifically the stretch from Unger to Tuli in Mokokchung district are expected to be completed by March 2025. Mr Zeliang is currently on a four-day tour to five districts of the state. In an update in a social media post yesterday, the Minister in charge said, on day three, the team met with KKB Project Pvt Ltd, the firm undertaking the 2-Laning works from Unger to Tuli. He said, they are behind schedule but with revised completion date on 22nd of March 2025, they are confident to meet the target. He also expressed concerned that some sections of the newly completed 2-lane road from Yisemyong to Unger shows signs of damage. To address this, Executive Engineer (NH) of the Mokokchung Division has been instructed to direct the contractor to immediately carry out repairs to prevent further deterioration. He interacted with the Contractor UCN Construction Company who is undertaking the work from Chuchuyimpang to Chare. With the road being targeted to complete by 18th of June next year, the Deputy Chief Minister expressed satisfaction over the work progress carried out by Contractor. Mr Zeliang further informed that he met the survey team for NH-202 Package-I, being undertaken by Consultant Group CM Engineering and said that at the current pace of work, the remaining stretch of Package-I should be completed by November end.
