G20 leaders have adopted the Rio de Janeiro Declaration at its 19th Summit in the Brazilian city. They have called for action on Climate Change and wars in Ukraine and West Asia. The Declaration released yesterday aimed at addressing major global challenges and crises and promote strong, sustainable, and inclusive growth. The declaration called for an enlarged Security Council composition that improves the representation of the underrepresented and unrepresented regions and groups. The declaration condemned terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. It called for peaceful resolution of conflicts and efforts to address crises with diplomacy and dialogue. It reaffirmed the strong commitment to multi-lateralism, especially in light of the progress made under the UNFCCC and the Paris Agreement.

On the 1st day of the G20 yesterday, on the sidelines of the summit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi met the state heads of Indonesia, Portugal, Italy, England and Norway. The priority points across all the bilateral were to review the cooperation in various areas of mutual-interest. Bilateral trade and discuss various areas of cooperation. One of the major highlights of these meetings was the announcement of 2 new consulates in the UK.

In line with the Prime Minister's vision of responsive and efficient governance, the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) organized the National Workshop on "Effective Redressal of Public Grievances" on Monday at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. In the workshop constant efforts of Govt, grievance resolution time in Central Secretariat, now stands at just 13 days was highlighted; the government's commitment to citizen-centric governance under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership was reflected.

Arunachal Pradesh won four gold and four bronze medals in Junior National Pencak Silat Championship, which concluded in Srinagar on Monday. Meanwhile the senior team from Arunachal Pradesh comprised of 17-member senior Pencak Silat team left for Srinagar to participate in the 2nd All India Pencak Silat

Championship 2024 to be held there at Sher Kashmir Indoor Sports Stadium from today to 21<sup>st</sup> of this month.

The APSHRC delegation is led by acting chairperson Bamang Tago and accompanied by other dignitaries and officials is attending the program to gain in-depth knowledge and skills related to human rights advocacy and the Commission's functions. The training program is part of the on-going efforts to enhance the capacity and effectiveness of the Arunachal Pradesh State Human Rights Commission, ensuring it is well-equipped to address human right issues with transparency, impartiality and a commitment to justice.

The 2nd edition of the Arunachal Rang Mahotsav (ARM) and the 1st International Theatre Festival are scheduled to take place from November 22 to December 10 at Indira Gandhi Park in Itanagar. In the festival eight productions which feature young actors from the state will be showcased, with participants from various districts of the state.

Continuing its crackdown on interstate drug trafficking, Banderdewa police has apprehended three more drug peddlers and seized 14.61 grams of suspected heroin, stated Naharlagun SP Mihin Gambo. Acting on a tip off, a trap was laid at Banderdewa, and two drug peddlers from Assam were arrested. One soap case and two vials containing suspected heroin weighing 14.61 grams were recovered from their possession. During interrogation, the accused disclosed that the narcotics were procured from one Md Sonnasi of Silonibari, Assam. The disclosure led to the apprehension of the third accused Sonnasi. A criminal case has been registered against them at Banderdewa Police Station under NDPS Act.

East Siang DC Tayi Taggu while launching the World Toilet Day Campaign 2024, organised by the department of PHE & amp WS, Pasighat Division, GoAP, on the theme of "Hamara Sauchalaya Hamara Samman" under the SBM (Grameen) in the district today at DC Conference Hall stressed on the individual and community responsibility for ensuring universal access to clean toilets as cleanliness begins from toilets. Universal access to clean toilets promotes hygienic practices, dignity and sanitation and health of their community.
