She emphasized understanding strengthening cultural heritage and India's its Highlighting the beauty of India's diversity, she credited national unity for overcoming challenges throughout history. She also reminded that colonial powers tried to weaken India's social fabric but failed due to the strong spirit of "Indianess" among citizens.
