As the country has multiple time zones, most polling stations are closing between 5.30 am and 9.30 am Indian Standard time today.

India's journey towards tuberculosis (TB) elimination has been recognized globally, with a noteworthy 17.7 percent decline in TB incidences from 2015 to 2023. As per the World Health Organization's Global Tuberculosis Report 2024 the rate is twice the global average decline of 8.3 percent. India, as a signatory to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals had pledged to achieve the "End TB" targets by 2025, five years ahead of the SDG deadline of 2030.
