Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the All India Conference of Directors General and Inspectors General of Police at Bhubaneswar in Odisha for two days, beginning today. Union Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated the three-day conference yesterday. The Conference is being held to provide an interactive platform for senior Police professionals and security administrators in the country to discuss and debate diverse national security-related issues. The meeting focuses on critical components of national security, including counter terrorism, Left Wing Extremism, coastal security, new criminal laws and narcotics among others. The President's Police Medal for distinguished service will also be awarded during the conference.



India has called upon Bangladesh to take all steps for the protection of the minorities.
