The External Affairs Ministry has said that India and the United States will work for the betterment of people and ensure peace and security. The Supreme Court yesterday held that recruitment rules for appointments in government jobs cannot be changed midway unless it is prescribed. A five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud held that 'rules of the game' once set before the start of the recruitment process cannot be tinkered with midway. The bench also said that the selection rules should not be arbitrary and should be in accordance with Article 14 of the Constitution. The top court unanimously held that transparency and non-discrimination should be the hallmarks of the public recruitment process and candidates should not be taken by surprise by change of rules midway.

The Apex Court yesterday ordered that the report on safety of medical professionals prepared by the National Task Force (NTF) be made available to the Chief Secretaries of all states and Union Territories, as well as other stakeholders, including doctors' associations. The NTF was formed by the Union Government following the Supreme Court's order in the aftermath of the ghastly rape and murder of a doctor at Kolkata's R.G. Kar Medical College & Hospital in August this year. The National Task Force has formulated recommendations in two categories: first, the prevention of violence against medical professionals and providing safe working conditions, and second, the prevention of sexual violence against doctors.

Giving a boost to mutual relations between India and Bhutan, Assam Governor Lakshman Prasad Acharya inaugurated the Darranga Immigration Check Post in the presence of Bhutan's Prime Minister, Lyonchhen Dasho Tshering Tobgay, in Tamulpur district yesterday.
