Justice Sanjiv Khanna will take oath as the 51st Chief Justice of India today. President Droupadi Murmu will administer oath of office to Justice Khanna at a special ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan in the morning. Justice Sanjiv Khanna has been part of several landmark Supreme Court judgments such as upholding abrogation of Article 370, scrapping the Electoral Bonds scheme and upholding the use of electronic voting machines EVMs. Justice Khanna will have a tenure of around six months.

Armed attackers from the hills fired from their automatic weapons and threw bombs in Manipur's Imphal East district yesterday. A police official in Imphal said that combined security forces of the army (Mahar regiment), Border Security and police have rushed to the areas and retaliated the firing leading to a heavy exchange of fire between the two sides at Thamnapokpi village. The armed cadres also fired many powerful bombs on the villagers and the security forces. Tension prevailed in the Thamnapokpi village and adjoining areas. During the past few days, farmers in a few districts were unable to work in their paddy fields due to the firing of armed attackers from hilltops towards the low-lying fields. To prevent the situation from escalating further, the Manipur Police deployed additional forces in the trouble-torn and vulnerable areas.

In Assam, today is the last day of the campaigning for the by-polls in the state. A total of 34 candidates are in the fray in the five assembly seats that are going to by-polls on 13th of this month. Several senior leaders of the NDA, Congress and BPF will try to woo the voters today in the poll bound areas. Over 10 lakh voters could exercise their voting rights in the five seats.

In the United States, Republican nominee Donald Trump has won Arizona, completing the party's sweep of all seven swing states in the presidential elections held on 5th of this month. Arizona, which holds 11 electoral votes, was the last battleground to declare its result, putting Trump's total at 312 electoral votes against Democratic candidate and Vice President Kamala Harris's 226. The other six swing states won by Trump in the presidential race are Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, North Carolina, Nevada and Georgia.
