Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said that decline in tuberculosis incidence is an outcome of India's dedicated and innovative efforts. Commending the country's progress, Mr Modi said in a social media post that through a collective spirit, the government will keep working towards a TB-free India. He added that the government remained steadfast in commitment to creating a TB-free India. According to the World Health Organization, India has recorded a decline of 17.7 percent in TB incidence from 2015 to 2023. This rate is more than double the global decline of 8.3 per cent. Sharing the information in social media post yesterday, Health Minister JP Nadda emphasized that this acknowledgment reflects India's transformative approach to

TB care and control. He mentioned that the government has expanded and strengthened the National TB Elimination Programme by taking key initiatives such as the NiKshay Poshan Yojana to provide essential nutritional support to TB patients.



Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal interacted with students community as he attended the 78th Foundation Day of Assam Medical College & Hospital and 62nd Foundation Day of Dibru College as the Chief Guest in Dibrugarh, Assam today. Mr. Sonowal highlighted the role that the PM Narendra Modi led Government played to revamp the education sector of the country, which has put India on track to be 'Viswa Guru.' Speaking to the young minds of Assam Medical College, the Union Minister, said, that the role played by any doctor is crucial to build scientific temperament in the society. He said, it is a matter of immense pride that the rich legacy of the Assam Medical College is in safe hands to further this temperament while enriching the lives of people, both physically as well as mentally. Mr Sonowal said, the prowess of doctor's community as well as that of our scientists proved essential to thwart the threat that COVID posed. Indian Railways is operating around 20 festival special trains today from Delhi-NCR to various parts of the country. These include special trains to Darbangha, Barauni, Patna, Katra, Muzaffarpur, Balia, Kamakhya, and Azamgarh. For Chhath Puja, 145 special trains are being operated from 2nd to 8th of this month, ensuring smooth travel during key ritual days of Chhath. The Railway is facilitating the movement of an additional two lakh passengers daily, ensuring seamless travel for millions of devotees during these festive occasions. Indian Railways is operating around 7000 special trains in view of festive season to accommodate significant surge in passenger traffic from 1st October to 30th November. Executive Director of Railway

Board, Dilip Kumar said, Railway is set to carry over one crore passengers during the festive period.



A mela for left out registrants of e-shram portal under Labour Department, Nagaland will be held for five days from 4th to 8th November in all District Civil Supply Offices. The Mela is jointly organised by the Departments of Labour and Food & Civil Supplies for issuance of Ration Card to all those left out registrants under e-shram Portal. All those e-shram registrants who are yet to be issued with Ration Card till today should avail this opportunity.



Minister of State for Environment, Kirti Vardhan Singh, launched India's updated National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (NBSAP) at the 16th meeting of the Conference of Parties in Colombia. During the launch event, the Minister highlighted India's 'whole-of-government' and 'whole-of-society' approach in updating its NBSAP. The updated biodiversity strategy acknowledges environmental challenges and outlines strategies to address them. It addresses the challenges through ecosystem restoration, species recovery programs, and community-driven conservation efforts. The Minister said the updated biodiversity strategy focuses on restoration of degraded ecosystems, protection of wetlands, and on sustainable management of marine and coastal areas. Mr. Singh also said, action plan is a vital roadmap to halt and reverse biodiversity loss by 2030, with a longer-term vision of living in harmony with nature by 2050. The document was released on 30th of last month.



Union Government today said that over 90 lakh tonnes of paddy have arrived in the mandis. Out of this, over 85 lakh tonnes were procured by state agencies and the Food Corporation of India in Punjab. Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food, and Public Distribution said, the paddy is being purchased at Minimum Support Price of 2320 rupees per quintal

as decided government for Grade 'A' paddy. The total paddy purchased by Government till date in the current Kharif Marketing Season amounts to 19,800 crore rupees and it has benefitted 4 lakh farmers. Central Government has fixed an estimated target of 185 lakh tonnes for paddy procurement for the ongoing marketing season which will continue till 30th November.



District Administration Mon in collaboration with ALIMCO (Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India), a Government of India undertaking will be distributing Aids and Appliances to identified persons with disabilities in need of Aids and assistive devices. Deputy Commissioner, Mon, Ajit Kumar Verma has informed that the Aids will be distributed based on special assessment camp held in various blocks of Mon district between 24th to 30th July 2024. The equipment Distribution camp will be held on 8th November at Deputy Commissioner Office Complex. Therefore, all concerned are requested to inform all selected beneficiaries (PwD's) based on assessment camp under the respective Blocks to attend the distribution event with any identity card (Aadhar card) along with Disability Proof.
