Meluri, inhabited by the Pochury Nagas, has officially been declared as the 17th district of Nagaland. The state government has announced the elevation of Meluri Sub-Division, currently part of Phek District, to a full-fledged district, with immediate effect. A notification officially issued by Chief Secretary Dr. J. Alam, on 2nd of November, stated that the jurisdiction of the newly formed district will encompass the area previously designated as Meluri Sub-Division. This move, aimed at improving governance and development in the region, follows the Cabinet's approval on November 1.



A four-member delegation of the 16th Finance Commission headed by Chairman Dr. Arvind Panagariya arrived in Nagaland today. The team was received by Nagaland Deputy Chief Minister Yanthungo Patton and other officials upon arrival at Dimapur Airport. Dr. Panagariya is accompanied by panel members Ajay Narayan Jha, Annie George

Mathew, and Dr. Manoj Panda. The team visited Heirloom Naga Centre, Sovima in Chumoukedima, where they were given a tour by the centre's founder Jesmina Zeliang. More from our correspondent.

In view of the meeting of the 16th Finance Commission tomorrow morning at Hotel Vivor, Kohima, all up vehicles proceeding towards Kohima from Wokha or Tseminyu side will be diverted from Meriema Junction towards New Secretariat from 09:00 AM to 06:00 PM. In a traffic advisory, Kohima Police has requested travelers to avoid non-essential vehicular travel on the stretch of road or take alternate road during the scheduled meeting from 09:00 AM to 06:00 PM.



President Droupadi Murmu today interacted with a group of women achievers in the Indian aviation sector at Rashtrapati Bhavan. This meeting took place under the initiative 'The President with the People,' which aims to establish a deeper connection with people and recognize their contributions. Speaking on the occasion, the President said that women are playing a key role in various operational and technical areas in India's civil aviation sector. She said, 15 percent of air traffic controllers, 11 percent of flight dispatchers, and 9 percent of aerospace engineers are women. President Murmu added, 18 percent of pilots who received commercial licenses last year were women. The President said

that the inclusive efforts of the government have given a boost to the progress of women in the civil aviation sector.



Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar has said that people in public administration should be committed to the values of nationalism, the idea of a developed and united India and to serving all Indian citizens without fear or favour. He was speaking at the 70th Annual Meeting of the General Body of Indian Institute of Public Administration in New Delhi today. Mr Dhankhar said, data is the bedrock and the fundamental premise of assessing needs of the society. He further said that developing soft skills, emotional intelligence, and cultural competence among public officials is crucial so that officials can understand the struggles of the marginalized and the underprivileged. The Vice President emphasized the need to enhance civil servants' problemsolving abilities and reinforce ethical leadership.



External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar formally inaugurated the new Consulate General of India in Brisbane, Australia today. On the occasion, Dr. Jaishankar said that the consulate will contribute to strengthening India's ties with Queensland, promoting trade, fostering educational linkages, and serving the diaspora. He termed the inauguration a landmark milestone in the increasingly strong bilateral relationship between India and Australia. The Minister also met the Governor of Queensland, Dr. Jeannette Young, and discussed opportunities and ways to strengthen economic, trade, and investment cooperation between India and Queensland.



Government e-Marketplace (GeM) has introduced 170 seed categories on the portal. The new categories feature nearly 8,000 seed varieties that can be procured by Central and State public sector units and other governing bodies for further distribution. The move aims to simplify access to quality agricultural and horticulture seeds, and ease the entire process for procuring authorities. This will increase efficiency, reduce time consumed in tendering processes, stimulate transparency in government procurement, while boosting participation of sellers across the country.



The Election Commission has announced the change of date of byelections in 14 assembly constituencies of Kerala, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh. Now the polling will be held on 20th of this month instead of 13th November. Date of counting remains unchanged and will be held on 23th of November. The decision has been taken in view of the representations received from various political parties and some social organisations, demanding to change the date of poll due to large scale social, cultural and religious engagements on 13th of this month.



With an aim to promote new and young talent in the country, the 55th edition of the International Film Festival of India (IFFI) has introduced a new award category, namely 'Best Debut Director of Indian Feature Film'. The official selection in the Best Debut Director of Indian Feature Film category include Lakshmipriya Devi for Boong in Manipuri language, Navjyot Bandiwadekar for Gharat Ganpati in Marathi, Manohara K for Mikka Bannada Hakki in Kannada, Yata Satyanarayana for Razakar in Telugu, and Ragesh Narayanan for Thanupp in Malayalam. The winner will be announced at the IFFI's Closing Ceremony on November 28.

The United States will vote for its 47th President tomorrow. Republican nominee and former President Donald Trump and Democratic candidate and Vice President Kamala Harris are locked in a tough fight for the top post. As the country has multiple time zones, polling in the US will begin tomorrow between 5.30 PM and 7.30 PM India Standard Time, and will close between 5.30 AM and 9.30 AM Indian time on Wednesday. Results of the elections are expected as polling closes, but it will take days before it is known who will be the next US president.
