Prime Minister Narendra Modi called upon the tech-savvy youth to save the elderly from the risk of cyber fraud and reiterated that there is no provision of digital arrest in the government. Addressing 116th episode of Mann ki Baat Prime Minister stressed that the elderly are the most common victims of such crimes and it is everyone's responsibility to keep them safe from cyber fraud. Mr. Modi announced that on the 162nd birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda next year, 'Viksit Bharat Young Leaders Dialogue' will be held in Delhi. The country celebrates Youth Day on 12th January every year to mark Swami Vivekananda's birth anniversary. Two thousand such youth selected from villages, blocks, districts, and states will gather at Bharat

Mandapam for the Dialogue. Prime Minister also urged youth from families without political background to join politics. He declared that in the next few months many special campaigns will be run in the country to connect one lakh such youth to politics. On the occasion of National Cadet Corps (NCC) Day today, Mr. Modi noted with satisfaction that the enrolment of girl cadets in NCC has risen to almost 40 percent from 25 percent.

Recalling his recent visits abroad, Prime Minister said the Indian Diaspora is helping preserve and promote Indian culture. Prime Minister mentioned that the "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" campaign has crossed the important milestone of planting 100 crore trees in just five months.



The 116th episode of 'Mann Ki Baat', the monthly radio program of Prime Minister, Narendra Modi was screened at Raj Bhavan in Kohima today. Speaking at the screening programme, Governor of Nagaland, La Ganesan commended the resilience, dedication and spirit of service represented by Naik Subedar Hokato Hotozhe Sema and Team Better Dimapur. He said, Naik Subedar Hokato H. Sema is not only an Indian Army Officer and a sportsman, but also a shining example of how adversity can be transformed into achievement. La Ganesan said Naik Subedar Hokato lost his leg in 2002, during an operation in Kashmir, yet his spirit remained unbroken and due to his perseverance and commitment, he won a bronze medal in the shot-put event for the country at the 2024 Summer Paralympics in Paris. The Governor also acknowledged the admirable efforts of Team Better Dimapur. He said their commitment to community service extends far beyond charity, as they are actively involved in promoting cleanliness, environmental protection and civic responsibility. The Governor added that we need more people like Naik Subedar Hokato and Team Better Dimapur to continue leading the way and to inspire many more young people to step forward and contribute to the progress and harmony of our community.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister, Kiren Rijiju has said that the government is ready to discuss any issue during the winter session of the Parliament beginning tomorrow. Talking to reporters after the all party meeting convened by the government in New Delhi today, Mr. Rijiju urged opposition parties to ensure smooth functioning of the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha during the session. Congress MP Pramod Tiwari said that the party has sought discussion on alleged bribery scam by an industrialist, Manipur situation, unemployment and pollution in North India. The all party meeting was presided over by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh.

The winter session will commence tomorrow and will continue till 20th of December. However, there will be no sitting of Parliament on 26th of November on account of commemoration of Constitution Day

In a significant development, National Consumer Helpline has partnered with over 1,000 companies under its Convergence Programme to expedite grievance resolution. These companies span over major sectors, including e-commerce, private education, FMCG, consumer durables, electronic products, retail outlets, automobiles and banking. Consumer Affairs Ministry said the complaints related to these convergence companies will be directly transferred to them for online resolution. The Ministry said, the number of convergence partners has steadily increased from 263 companies in 2017 to one thousand nine companies.



Task Force for Music & Arts (TaFMA), under the Government of Nagaland, has informed that Mari Mathias from Wales will be performing at the upcoming Toyota Hornbill Music Festival 2024 at Naga Heritage village, Kisama on December 1 and 2.
