Nagaland Chief Minister Niephiu Rio today launched several Economic Empowerment initiatives of the state namely the Ura Cab, Nagaland Tourism Connect- Hornbill Edition and Digital Piggery Insurance. The launch programme was held simultaneously with the culmination ceremony of the Hornbill Capacity Building training at Capital Convention Centre Kohima. Ura Cab is a home grown taxi aggregation platforms wherein it will provide tourists a hassle free booking and taxi owners with a stable and remunerative platform. The Ura Cab will integrate not only the four wheeler tourism taxis but also two-wheeler taxis making travel more accessible and affordable for everyone. More than 90 new fleet of vehicles were introduced under Nagaland Tourism Connect- Hornbill Edition, which are specially branded to represent state's identity and commitment to offering memorable travel experience. The launch of one of India's first Digital Piggery Insurance scheme, initiated by the State Finance department, implemented with the support of the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India and Tata AIG, to address long-standing hurdles in livestock insurance particularly the complexities of post-mortem procedures for claim settlements. Speaking at the launch ceremony, Chief Minister Rio said these milestones reflect Government's commitment to empowering local entrepreneurs and enhancing tourism infrastructure.

Principal, ITI Tuensang, Netenba Ajem while delivering his keynote address, emphasized the significance of the initiative in addressing the skill gap, particularly in rural areas, and empowering the youth with the necessary skills to excel in the modern world. SDO (Civil) Thonoknyu, Tsiasie Phoji encouraged the participants to make the most of the opportunity to acquire new skills that would benefit their livelihoods.

The meeting also called for cooperation from all line departments including key aspects like such as logistics, security arrangements, cultural performances, vendor managements and crowd control to make the event successful and enjoyable for all participants and visitors.

The District Planning and Development Board, DPDB Wokha today recommended setting up of three Health Sub-Centres at Saron, Airfield and Suren colony in Wokha town. The decision was taken during the DPDB meeting held at Deputy Commissioner's Conference hall, Wokha under chairmanship of MLA Y. M. Humtsoe. Attending the meeting, Advisor Mhathung Yanthan appealed all line departments to come up with comprehensive plans and reports in regard to implementation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan, as this is one important toll for the development at the grassroots level.

Nagaland Directorate of School Education has informed the authorities of both government and private schools that Aadhaar has become mandatory for availing all government schemes including stipends, scholarships, APAAR ID, student PEN. In this, the department said it is important that school authorities identify school children without Aadhaar cards and prioritize their enrollment to avoid any disruption in the benefits provided by the government schemes. The Department advised the schools to utilize the facilities at EBRCs and organize enrollment camps within school premises to support the Aadhaar registration process.
