Health and Family Welfare Minister, P Paiwang Konyak today visited the Dr. Imkongliba Memorial District Hospital, IMDH in Mokokchung. The minister announced a funding allocation of 3 crores for completion of the hospital's new building, along with an additional 2 crore for the establishment of a Critical Care Unit. During his visit, the minister interacted with the public where representatives of Ao Senden expressed concerns about the quality of the materials being used for the construction of the new building. Mr. Konyak assured that all such matters would be thoroughly addressed. He assured that the construction would be completed at the earliest. Meanwhile, he inspected the local pharmacies and fish vendors. The minister also visited the Ayush Hospital at Sabangya.



PHED and Cooperation Minister, Jacob Zhimomi has called for greater unity among Naga tribes to achieve lasting recognition and progress. Mr. Zhimomi emphasized on the importance of solidarity and collaboration across all tribes in Nagaland to foster socio-economic and political growth. The minister was today speaking as the Chief Host at the cultural exchange programme organized by Central Nagaland Tribes Council, CNTC at Senden Riju, Purana Bazar, Nagaland. Highlighting the importance of

inclusivity, Mr. Zhimomi urged all 17 tribes of Nagaland, including those in the newly recognized Meluri district, to unite for the state's prosperity.

Mr. Zhimomi underscored the need for a collective voice to ensure that all tribes benefit from a potential resolution to the Naga political issue. Road and Bridges Minister Kaito Aye in his speech as the Special Guest, lauded the CNTC for organizing an impactful event that celebrated the rich cultural heritage of the Naga people. Mr. Aye urged the CNTC to play a more active role in promoting peace and unity. the Minister emphasized on the importance of resolving differences and misunderstandings among communities to pave the way for lasting peace.



Nagaland Home Commissioner, Vyasan R today directed all the departmental officers and staff to actively participate in the mass social work to be held at Kohima on November 22 from 6 AM onwards. The Home Commissioner's Office in a circular said that all government employees should compulsorily take part in the social work and strict attendance will be taken by the department concerned. The circular directed all departments to inspect their designated areas in advance and arrange equipment and tools needed to make the mass social work a success. Stating that shops and business establishments will remain closed till 12 noon, it asked shop and business owners to clean their premises during the closure time. Moreover, the public have been requested to take active part in the mass social work in their own wards and colonies.

Dimapur District Congress Committee, DDCC has criticized the government over the deteriorating road conditions and implementation of schemes. Addressing a press conference at Congress Bhavan today, DDCC President

Kutoho Chishi said the commercial hub of Nagaland lacked adequate infrastructure causing significant hardship for the public. He highlighted the traffic congestion caused by ongoing repairs of the over-bridge and the hazardous conditions created by numerous potholes. The DDCC President urged the government to take immediate action to repair the roads. He called on the newly elected municipal bodies to honor their electoral promises and work for the betterment of their respective wards. Mr. Chishi raised concerns regarding several public welfare schemes and alleged that money being is collected from beneficiaries of Pradhan Mantri Gram Awas Yojana and deduction made for job cards. Mr. Chishi further alleged that under Jal Jeevan Mission, completion certificates were being issued without proper work being done.



Chief Miniter Neiphiu Rio along with Deputy Chief Ministers Yanthungo Patton and TR Zeliang today called on Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in New Delhi. Mr. Rio in a social media post said that they discussed about important development projects for further strengthening Nagaland's economic growth. In another post, Mr. Rio announced that Peru and Japan will be the Partner Countries for the upcoming 25th Edition of the Hornbill Festival, scheduled to be held from December 1. The announcement was made after Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio, his cabinet colleagues and senior officials of the State Government met with Ambassador of Puru to India, Javier Manuel Paulinich Velarde today. Mr Rio said Peruvian artistes and cultural performers will participate in various events.

In this regard, all concerned offices, departments, organizations and citizens of Kohima have been requested to cooperate and actively participate in the Social Work.
