The Centre's One Rank One Pension (OROP) Scheme completes ten years today. It is a transformative scheme implemented by the Government to ensure fair and equal pension payments for Exservicemen. The scheme ensures that veterans who retire at the same rank and with the same length of service receive equal pensions, regardless of their retirement date. Union Home Minister Amit Shah today announced that the Government will soon bring National Counter Terrorism Policy and Strategy to fight terrorism.

Inaugurating two-day Anti-Terror Conference organised by National Investigation Agency NIA in New Delhi, Mr Shah said, in the last 10 years, since Prime Minister Narendra Modi took charge, the government has adopted a strong approach against terrorism. Mr Shah said, a strong ecosystem has been developed in the country to fight against terrorism in the last ten years. He said, there has been a 70 per cent reduction in terrorist incidents from 2014 to 2021 in comparison to the period from 2006 to 2013. The Union Home Minister said, the terrorist attacks and their conspiracy are against the country in a borderless and invisible manner. Mr. Shah stressed the need for special training for young officers saying they have to be equipped with the latest technologies.



Lotha Community celebrated Tokhü Emong today in Wokha, Dimapur and Bhandari town with festive fervour. In Wokha, Lok Sabha Member of Parliament, S.
