MANIPUR

In Manipur, all schools and colleges will reopen from today. An order issued by the state government said that normal classes will resume from today including universities. All educational institutions have been closed since the 16th of this month after widespread protests took place in the valley districts, condemning the killing of six persons in Jiribam district. However, the internet ban is still in force in selected districts of the State, while the curfew has been relaxed for some hours in some districts.

MoU-NSE

In Meghalaya, the Education Department yesterday signed an MoU with the National Stock Exchange of India Limited to impart financial literacy, investor awareness in securities market and other training programs across the state. The MoU was signed by the Director of Higher and Technical Education representing the Education Department, Govt of Meghalaya and Chief Business Development Officer, National Stock Exchange of India Limited in the presence of Chief Minister, Conrad K Sangma, Education Minister, Rakkam A Sangma, Chief Secretary, D P Wahlang and other government officials. This is in line with generating employment opportunities for rural and urban youth in the Banking, Financial Services and Insurance Sector which will empower and provide a platform for skill development to the youth of the state.

CS-MIZORAM

In Mizoram, newly appointed Chief Secretary, Khilli Ram Meena has assumed office yesterday. Mr Meena, a 1993-batch IAS officer of the AGMUT cadre served as Additional Secretary in the Ministry of Minority Affairs before he was repatriated to his parent cadre recently. The Centre on November 21, appointed Meena as the new Chief Secretary of Mizoram to succeed Renu Sharma, who retired on superannuation in October.

SIKKIM

North East Regional Centre- Indian Council of Historical Research Guwahati in collaboration with Sikkim University organised a two-day National Seminar on the Indian Constitution and the idea of Ram-Rajya at Chintan Bhawan, Gangtok yesterday. The programme was graced by Dr Jyoti Prakash Tamang, Vice Chancellor and professor at the Sikkim University. The seminar was attended by authors, editors, key note Speaker, Prafulla Ketkar besides scholars from different states of India, faculty members and students of various colleges in Sikkim. 'Ram Rajya', a concept rooted in ancient Indian philosophy, symbolizes the ideal governance envisioned by the Constitution of India.
