#### **MAHOTSAV**

Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) Minister, Jyotiraditya Scindia yesterday said that the upcoming inaugural Asthalakshmi Mahotsav will bridge the cultural and economic gap between Northeast India and the rest of the nation. The Asthalakshmi Mahotsav will be held from 6th to 8th December at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi, showcasing the cultural, natural and artisanal wealth of all the eight North-East states. Addressing a press conference in New Delhi, Mr Scindia said that the Mahotsav will not only showcase the cultural richness of the Northeast but also serve as a catalyst for economic development, creating new opportunities for artisans, weavers, and entrepreneurs from the region. The Minister also launched the event's mascot-Purvi, a young girl representing the North-East, with elements from each state featured in her attire.

#### RESCUE

Manipur Chief Minister Shri. N. Biren Singh informed that the State Government, in coordination with the army and other central forces, is taking up every possible step to rescue Laishram Kamalbabu from Loitang Khunou, who has gone missing from the campus of GOC, 57 Mountain Division. The Chief Minister said that he had met the members of the Joint Action Committee formed against missing of Laishram Kamalbabu, along with Social Welfare Minister. The State Government has taken matter with utmost seriousness, the Chief minister said, stating that the State Government has strongly urged the concerned authority for assistance in rescuing Kamalbabu. He further appealed the public to remain calm, adding that the Government has been taking up all possible steps in finding the missing person.

#### MARKETING

The Arunachal Pradesh Agriculture Marketing Board (APAMB) and the Indo Tibetan Border Police (ITBP), North East Frontier, have signed a 'Memorandum of Understanding' under 'Mission Arun Himveer' in presence of Chief Minister Pema Khandu in Itanagar yesterday. Under the initiative the state government through the marketing board will supply fruits, vegetables, meat and poultry products procured from local farmers to the ITBP. The Mission envisages to achieve short term goals of the Marketing Board in providing readymade markets from far flung villages and circles with low market linkage and creating a vibrant economy besides solving employment issues across the state. He said that Mission Arun Himveer will have a far-reaching impact on accelerating 'reverse migration' of people, who have left their villages to towns and cities.
