CHIEF JUSTICE

Justice Sanjiv Khanna took oath as the 51st Chief Justice of India. President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Justice Khanna at a ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan yesterday. Justice Sanjiv Khanna succeeds Justice D.Y. Chandrachud, who demitted office on Tuesday. Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, several Union ministers, and judges of the Supreme Court attended the ceremony, among others. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has conveyed best wishes to Justice Sanjiv Khanna on taking oath as Chief Justice of Supreme Court of India. In a social media post, Mr Modi said, he attended the oath taking ceremony of Justice Sanjiv Khanna, who has been sworn in as the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of India. He conveyed best wishes for his tenure.

EDUCATION

Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan will inaugurate a two-day national workshop on Higher and Technical Education with Secretaries of States and Union Territories today. MOU

Assam Government signed a tripartite MoU with the Capacity Building Commission and Karmayogi Bharat in Guwahati yesterday. This MoU aims to bolster the implementation, facilitation and engagement with Mission Karmayogi Programme of the Centre for Capacity Building of civil servants in Assam by bringing in Framework of Roles Abilities and Competencies framework, heralding a shift from Rule-based to Role-based Competency Building for Civil Servants and bringing in IT Intervention in Training of Civil Servants through the active usage of iGoT Karmayogi Portal and blended training methods as per the parameters set by Capacity Building Commission. The tripartite MoU was signed by Ravi Kota, Chief Secretary of the state

and V. Lalithalakshmi, CEO Karmayogi Bharat and Secretary, CBC on behalf of Capacity Building Commission and Karmayogi Bharat.

GUNFIGHT

In Manipur, at least ten suspected militants were killed in a gunfight with security forces in Jiribam district yesterday. According to the Police report, the gunfight took place at Jakuradhor under Borebekra Subdivision which is about 29 kilometre away from Jiribam district headquarter. Heavily armed militants coming down from the nearby hill ranges torched several abandoned houses, shops and other buildings in different villages under Borobekra Subdivision and the militants also fired numbers of explosives in the area. The report further said that additional security forces rushed to the area and conducted a search operation. Afterward, the suspected armed militants attacked a CRPF camp and a gunfight broke out. Later, security forces recovered ten dead bodies suspected to be militants. One CRPF jawan sustained bullet injury in the incident.

FUNERAL

Lyngkhoi Village, located in the Meghalaya’s East Khasi Hills District, along with the Catholic Church, yesterday held a solemn ceremony to pay their final respects to soldier Aibok Madur, who tragically passed away on November 7th at Siachen Glacier in Jammu and Kashmir. Following his death, Aibok Madur's body was brought to his mother's home in Mawbri Village, Ri Bhoi District on November 9th, and then to his wife house on November 10th. His mortal remains were laid to rest at the Catholic Cemetery in Lyngkhoi yesterday. Assam Regiment Center paid their last respect to Aibok Madur along with other mourners. After the ceremony, the Assam Regiment carried the coffin and loaded it into a vehicle, which then proceeded to the cemetery. Along the route, school children and villagers, holding Indian flags, lined the streets to bid farewell to the fallen soldier.
