The Ministry of Defence has said that 'Swarnim Bharat: Virasat aur Vikas' will be the theme of tableaux for Republic Day 2025. In addition, 11 Ministries and the Department of Union government have also been selected. The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) has unveiled a new posting policy. CISF Inspector General Dr. K.C. Samantaray said, for the first time, choice-based posting has been introduced, wherein each personnel will have the opportunity to list ten preferred locations. He said, personnel retiring within two years will be given a posting out of three choices, and they will be given first priority. Dr. Samantaray highlighted that the new policy will impact over 98 percent of the force.

Nagaland will participate at the 37th Senior National Tug-of-war Championships scheduled for January 5 to 8, 2025 in Mumbai. The event is being organised by the Tug-of-War Federation of India, affiliated with the Tug-of-War International Federation. The state's team of 10 men will compete in the Men's senior (Catch weight) category at the championship. The players were selected following a trial conducted during the recent Nagaland tribal tug-of-war competition organized by the Tribal Affairs Department.



India Meteorological Department has forecast very likely ground frost at isolated pockets in Nagaland, Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya. It also predicts shallow to moderate fog at isolated pockets over all northeastern states. According to IMD, dry weather is very likely to continue over Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura, with no significant change in minimum temperature.
