Addressing the celebration of the State Level Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav 2024 at the Directorate of School Education, DOSE, Kohima, Dr. Yhome emphasized that language plays an important and powerful role in the society as it is one's identity and culture. The event was celebrated under the theme "Unity through Languages". Speaking at the Indian Languages Festival, Associate Professor, Department of Tenyidie, Nagaland University, Dr. Mimi Kevichusa Ezung called upon all Tribal Literature Boards to document their oral stories and folklore to keep their language and culture alive. Earlier, chairing the programme, Principal Director, DOSE Thavaseelan K said that celebrating Indian Languages Festival is a week-long event to celebrate the diversity of Indian Languages and Culture. Highlights of the programme included poetry recitation in various Naga dialect and cultural presentation by government schools.



Both the Houses of Parliament today witnessed heated exchange of words between the Treasury and Opposition bench MPs on various issues. The Rajya Sabha was adjourned for the day, while the Lok Sabha till 2 PM. When the Upper House assembled after the first adjournment at 12 Noon, Leader of the House and Union Minister JP Nadda demanded a discussion in the House over the issue of alleged

links of Congress leaders with US-based George Soros Foundation. He accused Congress led opposition of deviating the attention of the people from this issue by bringing a no-confidence motion against Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar. Mr. Nadda said, the Congress has never shown respect to those who are holding constitutional positions. Later, the Deputy Chairman adjourned the House for the day. Earlier, when the House met this morning, Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar rejected the adjournment notices moved by the opposition MPs on various issues. When the Lok Sabha assembled in the morning, the Question Hour was taken up by the House without any disruptions. After completing the business, the House took up Zero Hour, in which Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi raised the law and order situation in Manipur.



25th edition of the Hornbill Festival 2024 drew a staggering Two Lakh Five Thousand 968 visitors this year, reflecting its growing global appeal. Among them were Two Thousand 527 foreign tourists, 56 Thousand 219 domestic visitors and One Lakh 47 Thousand 716 local tourists from Nagaland. On the final day alone, the event saw an impressive turnout of 32 Thousand 18 attendees, comprising 23 Thousand 816 local visitors, Eight Thousand 113 domestic tourists, and 152 international guests. Known for showcasing the rich cultural heritage of the Naga tribes, the Hornbill Festival featured a vibrant mix of traditional dances, indigenous games, craft exhibitions, and culinary delights, drawing visitors from all walks of life.



Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi has said that it is the responsibility of the Government to run the Parliament and his party is in favour of smooth conduct of the House. Talking to reporters outside Parliament today, Mr Gandhi said his party wants debate and discussion on the constitution which is scheduled on the 13th of this month. On the ruckus in Parliament, BJP MP and party spokesperson Dr Sudhanshu Trivedi said, the main reason for the disruption is that INDIA block has lost confidence in Congress and there have been attempts to cover it. He alleged that the No-Confidence motion brought against Rajya Sabha Chairman is part of that coverup by Congress party.



Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman emphasized today that governments and industries worldwide need to work together to restore global calm. Addressing the gathering at the Opening Plenary Session of CII's Global Economic Policy Forum in New Delhi, Ms Sitharaman highlighted that the global priority in this decade should be to restore normalcy. She said that war and disruption must be avoided as they are the main causes of supply chain disruptions.
