Prime Minister Narendra Modi met Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck and Queen Jetsun Pema Wangchuck in New Delhi today. During the meeting, Modi admired Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck's vision for Bhutan's progress and regional development. In a social media post, the Prime Minister said, both countries are committed to advancing the unique and enduring partnership between India and Bhutan. External Affairs Minister Dr S Jaishankar had received them at the airport today morning.

The Rajya Sabha today resumed discussion on the Bharatiya Vayuyan Vidheyak 2024. The Lok Sabha has already passed the Bill in the Monsoon session this year. The Bill empowers the Central Government to make rules regulating the design, manufacture, maintenance, sale, export, or import of any aircraft and to secure the safety of aircraft operations. The Bill is also aimed at empowering the government to make rules for the investigation of any air accident or incident.

ISRO today launched PSLV C-59 launch vehicle carrying PROBA 3 spacecraft into a highly elliptical orbit from Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota. After the launch, ISRO on social media platform 'X' said, PSLV-C59 has successfully soared into the skies, marking the commencement of a global mission led by NewSpace India Limited, with ISRO's technical expertise, to deploy European Space Agency's groundbreaking PROBA-3 satellites.

Celebrating the remarkable diversity of the North East region, the first-ever Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav will be celebrated from 6th to 8th December next at Bharat Mandapam, Pragati Maidan, Delhi. The festival scheduled to be inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi aims to showcase the beauty, diversity, and promise of the eight states of Northeast India. The first ever Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav aims to offer a dynamic stage for showcasing Northeast India's vibrant textile sector, tourism opportunities, traditional craftsmanship, and distinctive Geographical Indication (GI) tagged products. It will serve as a celebration of the region's cultural wealth while focusing on its strategic importance in India's future development.

Governor K T Parnaik graced the 10th Convocation of North Eastern Regional Institute of Science and Technology today. A total of 610 graduates and post graduates received their degrees while 76 were awarded with PhD. The MoA was signed between Tawang DC Kangki Darang and Brig V S Rajput of the 190 Mountain Brigade.
