Union Home Minister Amit Shah today said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has brought north east at the focal point of the world. Addressing the 72nd plenary of North Eastern Council in Agartala, the Home Minister said that last 10 years have been very important for north east. He said, the Union Government is inspiring investors to make investment in the north east. He said establishment of peace is the most important thing that has happened in the region, wherein about 10,500 rebels have shun violence and surrendered themselves. Noting that Ashtalaxmi concept is being embraced by the country and world, the Union Home Minister said, Act East, Act Fast And Act First mantra

are being implemented by North East Council in letter and spirit. Speaking on the occasion, Minister for Development of North Eastern Region, Jyotiraditya Scindia noted that there has been a 71 percent drop in extremist activities and 60 percent drop to the loss of human life in the region.

Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has called for enhancing the budget allocation for the North Eastern Council (NEC) besides increased delegation of powers for sanctioning projects. He was speaking at the 72nd NEC Plenary at Agartala today. While appreciating initiatives taken for the North Eastern states under the schemes of PM DevINE and NESIDS (ROADS), Mr. Rio, however, noted that the financial outlay for Nagaland under the schemes between the period 2022-23 to 2025-26 were insufficient for undertaking major projects. He therefore, urged the ministry to consider increasing the budgetary allocation for the schemes to sustain impactful projects that address the regional aspirations and foster inclusive development.

Further, Mr. Rio highlighted the issue of delays in approval and clearance of projects by NITI Aayog and Line Ministries. To this, he suggested formulating a time schedule for timely submission, approval and implementation of projects. For Nagaland, Mr. Rio requested support from the DoNER Ministry and NEC for approval of projects including Construction of Airport at Ciethu, Foot Hill Road, Multi-Disciplinary Sports Complex at Dimapur, and Indian Institute of Science Education and Research. He also appealed the Centre to review the inclusion of Nagaland under Protected Area Permit, saying it would affect tourists and investors to the State. Mr. Rio mentioned that the state is peaceful, and had successfully conducted the 25th edition of Hornbill Festival.

Union Minister for Environment, Forest, and Climate Change, Bhupendra Yadav, today released the India State of Forest Report 2023 in Dehradun, Uttarakhand. Published biennially by the Forest Survey of India, the report offers a comprehensive assessment of the nation's forest and tree resources. It covers critical topics such as forest cover, tree cover, carbon stock, forest fire incidents, and agroforestry.

According to the report, India's total forest and tree cover spans 827,357 square kilometres, accounting for 25.17 percent of the country's geographical area. Additionally, the total forest cover has increased by 1,445 square kilometres compared to the 2021 assessment. As per the report, Nagaland is among the eight states and Union Territories to have a forest cover of above 75 percent.

YouthNet has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY). The five-year partnership aims to empower technology-driven startups, fostering a more inclusive and robust entrepreneurial environment in the country.
