Prime Minister Narendra Modi emphasized that the Constitution is the core pillar of unity in the country. Terming unity in diversity a unique feature of the country, the Prime Minister said that his government's policies and decisions are directed towards strengthening the unity of the country. The Prime Minister said this while he was responding to the special discussion on the glorious journey of 75 years of the Constitution of India in the Lok Sabha yesterday. The Prime Minister highlighted the steps taken by the NDA government to bring Unity in the country through various schemes and initiatives. He said, article 370 was abrogated in Jammu and Kashmir and one nation one tax GST has been implemented in the country. He said the One Nation One Ration Card, Ayushman card, One Nation One Grid and inclusive infrastructure development have helped the people of the country. On the country's rapid economic expansion, the Prime Minister said, India is committed to becoming a developed nation and it will become the third largest economy in coming years.
