The Lok Sabha has approved the Supplementary Demands for Grants-First Batch for 2024-2025. The government sought approval of Parliament to authorise gross additional expenditure of over 87 thousand 762 crore rupees. Out of this, the proposals involve net cash outgo aggregate to 44 thousand 142 crore rupees for payments of debts, liabilities, and interest rates. The House also gave its nod to the Appropriation Bill to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of India for the services of the financial year 2024-25. Replying to the discussion, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said that India is the fastest growing economy in the world.

Ms Sitharaman said, the government has increased the capital expenditure to boost the economy and over 11 lakh crore rupees budgetary allocations have been made in this year's Budget.

Nagaland Government has appointed Government Nominee members to various Municipal and Town Councils across the state with the provisions of the Nagaland Municipal Act 2023. In a notification issued by the Chief Secretary yesterday, stated that the newly appointed Government Nominee members will have the right to attend and speak at council meetings, although they will not have voting rights. Their tenure will align with that of the Urban Local Bodies, as per the provisions of the Act.

Food Safety Officials conducted an inspection of hotels, restaurants, tea stalls, and bakeries in Kohima town yesterday, identifying unsanitary conditions at three restaurants and a bakery. The establishments found in violation were Jat Restaurant, CT Restaurant, UP Tea Stall and Bright Bakery.

During the inspection, the bakery was also found using advance date on cookies/biscuits which was seized by the officials. As a results, these establishments were being served 'Improvement Notice' under Section 32 of Food Safety & Standards Act, 2006. A follow-up inspection will be conducted and if the businesses fail to comply with the directives, their Food Licence/Registration Certificates would be suspended. In the light of the coming festive season, the bakeries are informed to use transparent wrapping materials of food grade especially for cakes to ensure that they are visible to the consumer.
