Prime Minister Narendra Modi today emphasised that this century is driven by technology and data, and that India is demonstrating the true power of democracy, demography, and data to the world. He also highlighted how the democratisation of digital technology is benefiting all sectors and sections of society. Mr. Modi was speaking after inaugurating the Rising Rajasthan Global Investment Summit in Jaipur. He said the development following the mantra of 'Reform, Perform and Transform' is visible in every sector. He noted today every expert and investor in the world is very excited about India.

Referring to the problems related to global supply and value chain, the Prime Minister emphasized that it is very important to have a large manufacturing base in India. Top business leaders of the country have reached Jaipur to participate in the summit, which is also hosting representatives from 32 countries.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi today launched Bima Sakhi Yojana at Panipat in Haryana to promote financial literacy and insurance awareness among women. This initiative of Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) will empower women aged 18 to 70 years, who are Class 10th pass, providing specialized training and a stipend for the first three years. During the function, the Prime Minister distributed appointment Certificates to prospective Bima Sakhis. Addressing the gathering, Mr. Modi said, the launch of Bima Sakhi Yojana is another step towards empowerment of women, who are a major driving force towards attaining a Developed India by 2047.

On the occasion, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said, the government has set a target to recruit over two lakh women under Bima Sakhi Yojana in three years.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said it is time for the youth brigade to join politics and contribute to the Nations progress to achieve the vision of a Developed India by 2047. Addressing a programme in Ahmedabad today, he said, the nation must prepare its youths to lead in every sector of the economy including politics. At the final today, Mr. Lemtur beat the three other finalists to emerged as the winner. He walked away with a cash prize of three lakh rupees. All the other finalists were also awarded gift hampers.
