Nagaland is celebrating its 62nd Statehood Day today. It was on this day in 1963 that Nagaland became the 16th state of India. Commemorating the significant milestone in Nagaland's history, the state-level celebration was held at the Nagaland Civil Secretariat Plaza in Kohima with Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio addressing the gathering. In his speech, the Chief Minister quoted the then President of India, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, who said, "friendship helps to build a society where hatred and violence tend to disrupt it. Let us avoid the latter and adopt the former." Mr. Rio emphasized that these words remain profoundly relevant today, underscoring the importance of
