Governor of Nagaland, La Ganesan today called for concerted efforts to complement the government's strategy in accelerating a robust response against TB. The Governor was addressing the Ni-kshay Mitra Campaign under Pradhan Mantri TB Mukt Bharat Abhiyan with elected representatives, administrative heads of departments and heads of departments at Raj Bhavan, Kohima. He highlighted that India is home to the highest number of TB cases, with approximately 28 lakh people affected annually.

The Governor expressed delight that there are 410 Nikshay Mitras in Nagaland comprising individuals and organizations committed to supporting nearly 1,000 TB patients. La Ganesan urged the participants to commit to adopting TB patients from their respective localities and to disseminate the message of the noble cause through collaborative efforts.
