Dimapur Police has arrested all seven individuals accused in connection with the assault of three persons at Thahekhu village in the early hours of December 17. The police also seized the two weapons - one AK-47 Rifle and one pistol -- which were allegedly used for threatening and assaulting the victims. Police said, a regular case under relevant sections of law has been registered at Sub-Urban Police station, Dimapur on 17 December, and intensive investigation is ongoing. Commissioner of Police, Dimapur, Kevithuto Sophie, addressed a press conference on the matter.

Dimapur Police have thanked all organizations, particularly the Thahekhu Village Council, for assistance in swiftly apprehending all the accused individuals.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah has called for mapping demographic data of people along the India-Myanmar border, especially in Nagaland, Mizoram and Manipur, to help in fencing of the border, and deterring infiltration. The Home Minister was speaking at the 12th meeting of the North Eastern Space Applications Centre (NESAC) Society in Agartala yesterday. He said, there is a need to carry out a comprehensive survey in the border areas. The Home Minister also emphasized the need for extensive mapping for mineral, oil, and coal reserves in the northeastern states, to enable the region to financially benefit from royalties received for these resources. Mr. Shah urged the NESAC Society to focus on forest area development, and map floods in the northeastern states.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will attend the Christmas celebrations in New Delhi tomorrow. The event is being hosted by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. The Prime Minister will interact with key leaders from the Christian community, including Cardinals, Bishops and prominent lay leaders of the Church. This is the first time the Prime Minister will attend such a programme at the Headquarters of the Catholic Church in the country.



Union Health and Family Welfare Minister JP Nadda has sought the support of states and union territories towards the ongoing 100-day Intensified TB Elimination Campaign. The Union minister said this during a virtual meeting with Chief Ministers and Health Ministers of all States and UTs on the matter yesterday. Mr. Nadda urged the states and UTs to monitor the campaign at the state-level and ensure the same is done at the district levels as well. He also encouraged involving other ministries and departments, as well as the support of Members of Legislative Assemblies and Councils to ensure community mobilization. Noting that states already have nearly two months stock of TB medicines, the Union Health Minister said, the Centre is working towards ensuring advance stock of at least six months is available for states. Nagaland Health Minster P. Paiwang Konyak also attended the meeting.



Central Consumer Protection Authority-CCPA has imposed a penalty of two lakh rupees on a Competitive exam coaching institute for advertising misleading claims regarding results of the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) Examination 2023. The CCPA has ordered the institute to discontinue the misleading advertisement with immediate effect. In a statement, the Consumer Affairs Ministry said,

the institute's advertisement claimed 13 students in Top 100, 28 students in Top 200, and 39 students in Top 300 in UPSC Civil Services Examination 2023, which is misleading. During the investigation, it was found that the institute offers more than 50 courses and most of the claimed successful students took a subject which comes into play after clearing Preliminary examination. Meanwhile, the ministry added that the Institute also used IAS in its advertisements and letterheads, creating a deceptive impression that the person who is owning the institution is or was an IAS officer.



The Department of Consumer Affairs will launch Jago Grahak Jago App, Jagriti App, and Jagriti Dashboard on Tuesday on the occasion of National Consumer Day 2024. These apps aim to enhance the capability of the CCPA in taking suo moto action against dark patterns. The Jago Grahak Jago App aims to provide essential e-commerce information about all URLs during a consumer's online activities, alerting them if any URL may be unsafe. The Jagriti App will allow users to report URLs where they suspect the presence of illegal patterns. The reports will be registered as complaints to the CCPA for possible redressal and subsequent action.



India has condemned the horrific attack in Magdeburg, Germany, that has reportedly killed five people and injured over 200. The Ministry of External Affairs in a statement described the incident as a horrific and senseless attack at a Christmas market. Seven Indian nationals were also injured in the attack. The Indian Mission in Germany is in touch with all those injured in the attack. The incident occurred Friday evening when a car rammed into the crowded market, which was full of shoppers buying things for Christmas



India Meteorological Department has issued dense fog warnings for Nagaland and other parts of Northeast till the 24th of December. It said, dense fog conditions are very likely to prevail during late night and early morning hours in isolated pockets of Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura. Further, the weather authority also cautioned that ground frost conditions are very likely in isolated pockets of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, and Tripura during the period. IMD also forecast a dry spell for the states this week.
