Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the Northeast holds immense potential to propel the country's growth. He added that the 21st century belongs to the East, to Asia, and to India. Mr. Modi underscored that several northeastern cities like Agartala, Guwahati, Gangtok, Aizawl, Shillong, Itanagar, and Kohima have huge potential, similar to big cities. The Prime Minister today inaugurated the Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. Highlighting the importance of the Mahotsav, Mr. Modi said that this is the first and unique event which will open huge investment

opportunities in the Northeastern states. He said this is a great opportunity for farmers, artisans, and craftsmen of the Northeast, as well as investors from all over the world. He added that the government is connecting the Northeast with the trinity of Emotion, Economy, and Ecology. Earlier at the event, children from the Northeastern states presented a sapling of the Peepal tree, the Ashtalakshmi Plant, to the Prime Minister.

President Droupadi Murmu today said education is the only path for the all-round development of a human being. She said getting employment should not be the only motto of education and students must acquire vast knowledge through education as it leads a person towards betterment. She said this while addressing students of Uparbeda Government Higher Primary School where she once studied about six decades ago.

Advisor for Industries & Commerce, Hekani Jakhalu, today said while entrepreneurship and business in Nagaland are still evolving concepts, the start-up culture is rapidly gaining momentum. She was speaking at the Buyers and Sellers Meet 2024 organised by the Department of Industries and Commerce at Bamboo Hall, Kisama. Noting that the market in Nagaland is still pure and unadulterated, Ms. Jakhalu highlighted the advantages of launching businesses early in such an environment. She assured continued support of the Government for both buyers and sellers to facilitate growth. On the sixth day of the Hornbill Festival today, Tribal Research Institute Nagaland under the Tribal Affairs Department marked a vibrant celebration of indigenous traditions with a variety of competitions. The State-Level Rice Husking Competition witnessed a total of 30 contestants representing 15 tribes. Ngapkhao & Ayo from Konyak tribe emerged winners of the competition, followed by A. Soyaü Phom & Hantenhaila of Phom tribe, and Mengzi & Lalam Lenthang of Kuki tribe in second and third positions, respectively. In the State-Level Chicken Coop Making competition, 13 tribes participated, comprising 12 males and one female contestant. Yongkhumse from Sangtam tribe was declared the winner. While Yemlongchaba from Chang tribe won second place, Lapshaü from Phom tribe came in at third. Other competitions included the 2nd Tribal Go-Karting Competition, and the 3rd State-Level Catapult Competition.

The semifinalists were Kezhaseluo Pienyü and Vemele Thingo. The event was held under the aegis of Nagaland Wrestling Association at Chiechama Ground today. In the 90KG and below Category, Seyiejalie secured the first position after defeating Tuputha Hesuh. In the 75KG and below Category. Keneiselie Khawakhrie was declared the champion, while Rokuokehie Khawakhrie came in second. For the first time, exhibition match for women category comprising of 65KG and below and 65KG and above was held during the Hornbill International Naga Wrestling. Altogether, 50 wrestlers, comprising 40 men and 10 women, participated in the championship. Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has said the event is a showcase of strength, skill and unity featuring wrestlers from various tribes of the State and beyond. Taking to X, Mr. Rio said he witnessed the Championship along with the Consul General, Royal Bhutanese Consulate, Guwahati, Jigme Thinlye Namgyal.
