Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio said the Hornbill Festival showcases the connection between the spiritual identity and ethno-indigenous heritage of Nagas. He said this during the Advent Christmas Devotional Service at Kisama today. The festival is a deliberate celebration of the cherished Naga identity, culture and traditions, he said, and added that the essence of the festival lies in the emphasis on our uniqueness and unity. The Chief Minister encouraged the gathering to embrace tolerance, forgiveness, and goodwill in the true Christian spirit during the season. Further, he reminded everyone to focus on the central figure of Christmas, Jesus Christ, who brought hope, peace, and salvation to the world. This is the first-ever such service held at the Naga Heritage Village during the Hornbill Festival. Musical performances by the Nagaland Chamber Choir and various churches added a spiritual and festive atmosphere to the event.



Union Minister for Labour & Employment and Youth Affairs & Sports, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya today asserted that the people of India have always stood by the world in times of need. He was on a visit to the War Cemetery at Kohima this morning, where he paid tribute to the brave personnel who sacrificed their lives in World War II while serving in the British Army. The Union minister also attended the Hornbill Festival at Naga Heritage Village Kisama, where he was received with a warm and traditional welcome. Describing the Hornbill Festival 2024 as a grand celebration of the Nagaland's rich traditions, vibrant dances, and soulful music, Dr. Mandaviya expressed gratitude for the hospitality to witness the diverse and colorful celebrations. At Kisama,

the Union Minister also paid visits to various stalls including Honey Hub run by the Nagaland Beekeeping & Honey Mission.



The eighth day of the ongoing 25th Hornbill Festival 2024 celebrated the vibrant cultural heritage of Nagaland, with an array of performances by 18 cultural troupes at Kisama. During the morning session of the show at the main arena, Union Minister for Labour & Employment and Youth Affairs & Sports, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, graced the event as the Honoured Guest. While, Additional Secretary & Financial Advisor from the Ministry of Textiles was the Honoured Guest in the afternoon session. The performances depicted the rich traditions of the various tribes inhabiting Nagaland, including folk songs, indigenous games, demonstration of tiger hunting and fire making, among others.



Union Home Minister Amit Shah today lauded the role of Border Security Force (BSF) in securing borders, preventing infiltration, counterfeit currency and dealing with Left-Wing Extremism. Mr Shah was speaking at the 60th Foundation Day celebrations of BSF at Jodhpur in Rajasthan.

Deputy Chief Minister T.R. Zeliang today encouraged all government officers and staff of various departments to work for the public with enthusiasm. He was addressing the closing programme of the Unity Mini Hornbill Festival cum Pre-Christmas celebration at Peren yesterday. Mr. Zeliang also called for unity and will power among officials, which he said is crucial for pushing all plans to fruition.



Advisor Transport & Technical Education Temjenmenba has impressed upon the need for a fire station at Mangkolemba in Mokokchung district. Mr. Temjenmenba has written to the Advisor Fire & Emergency Services, Home Guards & Civil Defense Kiusumew Yimchunger seeking allocation of funds for prompt construction of the Fire Station at the area. The request comes after a devastating fire broke out at Nokyu ward in Mangkolemba Sub-Division this morning, razing a total of five houses -- including two main grocery shops -- to the ground. Additional Deputy Commissioner Mangkolemba, Moakumzuk Tzudir told Akashvani that although the site for a proposed fire station had already been earmarked, no sanction of funds had come from the government for construction. He expressed gratitude to the public for volunteering in helping douse the fire and preventing further damage. Meanwhile. Advisor Temjenmenba asked the Deputy Commissioner Mokokchung to arrange immediate Emergency Relief Fund to the affected families of the fire incident.



The Indian Army's Trishakti Sappers from the Eastern Command have developed the Advanced Flood Monitoring System (AFMS). The work is earning national acclaim at Inno Yodha, a competition for defense and disaster management innovations. Sensitised by last year's Glacial Lake Outburst Flood in Sikkim, AFMS, led by Hav Suresh PK of the Engineer Regiment, used cutting-edge technology to monitor water levels in real time to issue early SMS alerts. This innovation enhances disaster preparedness, enabling swift responses to protect troops and civilians.



In international news, Syrian rebel forces have taken control of the capital Damascus today after a week-long lightning offensive, encountering no resistance from government troops. It comes amid media reports that President Bashar al-Assad, has fled the country to an undisclosed location, marking the end of 24 year-rule. The historic shift comes after a swift offensive that saw rebels capture four major cities in less than two weeks. Media reports also quoted Syrian Prime Minister Mohammad Ghazi al-Jalali saying that he is ready to handover the government to the opposition forces in a peaceful transition.
