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President Droupadi Murmu has said that the foundation of a developed India could be laid only on the basis of self-reliant and capable local bodies. Given that about 64 percent of the country's population lives in villages, she said the development and empowerment of villages and villagers is important to make India a developed nation. Going to court not only wastes money and time but also increases unnecessary pressure on the court and the administration. She urged all the elected representatives to make efforts to resolve the disputes among the villagers at the Panchayat level itself.
