#### **COMMITTEE**

It may be mentioned that the Ministry of Education has granted 15 days extension to the two-member committee to submit its probe report into the allegations of mismanagement and administrative failures in the North Eastern Hill University. Meanwhile, Vice chancellor in-charge Prof Nirmalemdu Saha informed that he would immediately convene a meeting of the Academic Council to decide on the need to resume the classes.
