NEWS IN ORDER:-

NRC

In Assam, the state government has decided that Aadhaar cards will not be issued to applicants who or whose families had not applied for inclusion in the National Register of Citizens. The move was aimed at checking infiltration. The Assam cabinet has taken this decision to check infiltration from Bangladesh in view of the apprehension by police and the BSF in Assam and Tripura. In his post on X, Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said, stricter guidelines for issuance of Aadhar to ensure infiltrators do not secure them and this will be a new deterrence against illegal infiltration. Sarma also said that the new move will ensure the genuineness of Aadhaar applicants and the General administration Department is the nodal agency for the implementation of the Standard Operating Procedure.

CATTLE

In Meghalaya, senior BJP legislator, Sanbor Shullai has urged to Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma to ensure smooth transportation of cattle to the state for traders with valid official documents following unease in state due to the ban on consumption of beef in Assam. The MLA, in his letter to Sarma said the recent beef ban in Assam has created concern among the residents of Meghalaya over the likelihood of a hike in beef prices. The BJP MLA also said the local bovine traders have repeatedly submitted their grievances over bringing bovines from other states to Meghalaya for legitimate business,

agriculture and allied purposes through Assam. The Assam government on the 4th of this month has decided to ban the consumption of beef in public, hotels, restaurants and community gatherings to further strengthen the Assam Cattle Preservation Act.

FESTIVAL

The fifth edition of Winter Tales festival was inaugurated by Tourism Minister, Paul Lyngdoh at Ward's Lake in Shillong yesterday. This year's theme is "Balance," reflecting the state's commitment to sustainable tourism. Addressing the gathering, the minister emphasized the importance of celebrating Meghalaya's unique strengths, including its natural beauty, music, and arts. He expressed pride in the festival's growth, which now showcases artisans, weavers, and entrepreneurs from all 12 districts of Meghalaya. He also announced that Meghalaya will participate in a major tourist festival in Gujarat next February, where the state will be recognized for promoting green tourism. The event promotes eco-friendly initiatives, including waste segregation and a plastic-free environment.
