Prime Minister Narendra Modi today inaugurated and dedicated the prestigious Sonamarg Tunnel to the nation, in Central Kashmir's Ganderbal district. In his address, Mr Modi said Viksit Bharat is only possible when all regions of the country are development.

Earlier, the Prime Minister inspected the tunnel and was briefed about the project. The opening of the tunnel is a major step towards making the Ladakh region accessible by road throughout the year.
