President Droupadi Murmu addressed the nation on the eve of Republic Day today and wished the 76<sup>th</sup> Republic Day. The President, while highlighting the country's economic progress in her address, said that the whole world is watching the pace of India's progress. She appealed to the youth of the country to cooperate in the progress. While highlighting the infrastructure, the President said that in these ten years, road, rail connectivity, etc. have progressed a lot. She said that the country is also committed to the progress of women and children. While discussing the on-going Maha Kumbh Mela in Prayagraj, the President called upon the countrymen to stay connected with their cultural and literary roots. She said that only through education can the youth of the country move forward.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah, today, said that more than 360 Vibrant Villages will have 4G-Connectivity by June this year. He said this while interacting with special guests from the Vibrant Villages in New Delhi, on the eve of the 76<sup>th</sup> Republic Day tomorrow. He said that out of the 662 Vibrant Villages, 474 such villages will have on-grid electrification and 127 villages will have off-grid electrification. He added that these schemes and initiatives are part of the government's mission to transform these vibrant villages through a bottom to top approach.

India is celebrating the 15<sup>th</sup> National Voters' Day today.
