Defence Minister Rajnath Singh asserted that the government is taking transformative policy reforms to create a robust defence industrial ecosystem, with a strong focus on self-reliance and fostering technological collaborations. Speaking at the Ambassadors' Round Table in New Delhi yesterday ahead of Aero India 2025, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh highlighted the nation's advancements in the defence and aerospace sectors, emphasizing the successful development of niche and cutting-edge technologies. The Minister pointed out that India is now among a selected group of nations capable of producing fourth-generation fighter aircraft, nuclear submarines, main battle tanks, and intercontinental ballistic missiles. He said the establishment of a C-295 aircraft manufacturing facility is a testament to the country's commitment to fostering international collaboration in defence. He also said the Indian aerospace and defence sector presents significant opportunities for foreign companies seeking new ventures and partnerships.



Nagaland Power and Parliamentary Affairs Minister KG Kenye has called upon the Chakhesang community to be peace crusaders and harbingers of peace. Pointing out that the Naga society presently fragmented and divided, Kenye urged the Chakhesang tribe to take up the role of uniting Naga society. Minister Kenye was yesterday addressing the Chakhesang Public Organization, CPO 43rd General Session-cum-Chakhesang Day hosted by the Phek Town Public Forum and held at the Town Hall, Phek Town. Furthermore, he also advised the upon civil society and it's leaders to refrain from political affiliations. He emphasized that public leaders should not carry political biases or political posts and affiliations to deliver justice and prevent party pressures. On the occasion, the CPO passed a Ten point resolutions prioritizing Naga Unity, Quality Education, and Environmental Conservation. The CPO further appealed to all Naga political groups to uphold peace and refrain from any form of violence or bloodshed within the Chakhesang jurisdiction.



The Combined Annual Training Camp for NCC Cadets from Nagaland State is underway at Wokha. During the camp, the cadets will undergo rigorous training like PT, Drill, Field Craft and Weapon Training and live firing. The camp is being conducted under the aegis of Kohima Group NCC from January 9 to 18 at the Assam Rifles Camp at Wokha. A total of nearly 400 NCC cadets and NCC Staff are participating in this camp.



The nomination process for the 70-member Delhi Assembly started yesterday with the issuance of the notification for the polls. On the first day of nominations, nine candidates filed their nominations from different assembly constituencies. The last day for nominations is the 17th of this month. Meanwhile, candidates from different political parties have started campaigning in their areas to woo the voters. Elections for the Delhi Assembly will be held on the 5th of next month, and the counting of votes will take place on the 8th of February.
