Chairman of the Autonomous Puroik Welfare Board, Kashok Solung called on Governor Lt. General KT Parnaik at Raj Bhavan, Itanagar today. The Governor was briefed on the welfare board and the challenges faced by the Puroik community. After a detailed deliberation, the Governor advised the board members to focus on ensuring that every member of Puroik community is registered and avail benefits from the Central and State governments' welfare programmes and schemes. The CM urged them to ensure completion of the entire project within a month's time. He advised Technical Advisor to the State Government, K C Dhimole, who accompanied him, to assess, re-align and re-design and complete the process within a month. Khandu also directed the concerned Executive Engineer to constantly monitor the progress and visit the sites frequently. The Chief Minister reiterated that the government's top priority is road connectivity and assured approval of roads to yet-to-be connected villages in the area, as urged by the local MLA. The 55 km Tali to Pipsorang road is being executed by RWD under the flagship PMGSY scheme.
